Keeping history alive

Despite incorporating two rivers linked by a canal, the full stretch of waterway, from Bristol to Reading (87 miles/140km), is known as the Kennet & Avon 'Canal'.

In 1810, the 57 mile (92km) canal section was completed, enabling cargo to travel from Bristol to London avoiding the perilous journey along the English Channel.

The opening of the Great Western Railway in 1841 heralded the gradual decline of the waterway. After decades of dereliction, dedicated volunteers restored the waterway, and it was fully reopened in 1990.

5 things to do at Bath Locks

- 1 Take a boat trip along the Kennet & Avon Canal and get a new view of the historic city.
- **2 Escape** the hustle and bustle of the city and relax by the canal with a picnic in Sydney Gardens.
- 3 Stroll along the towpath to the crossover bridge, which was originally built for boaters where towpaths switched sides. This meant they didn't need to unhitch their horses when towing boats along the canal.
- 4 Discover more about the waterway with the audio trails between Halfpenny Bridge and Darlington Wharf keep a look out for the trail signs as you walk along.
- 5 Stop for a chat with our friendly volunteers who will tell you more about the area and the work we do.

Did you know?

The lock gates that you can see on the canal are made in our workshops using the same methods as were used 200 years ago. Each lock gate is unique and can take up to a month to make.
