Keeping history alive

The Grand Union Canal was once one of Britain's key transport routes. It links London with Birmingham and at 137 miles (220km) is the longest canal in the country.

This canal isn't one single waterway. Between 1894 and 1929 several independent canals were amalgamated to create the Grand Union Canal.

The Aylesbury Arm of the Grand Union Canal opened in 1814, bringing major industry to the town for the first time.
